
#### Confession and Absolution

# The Epistle Reading


1 John 3:1-7

Sermon: "Being an Outlaw is Bad" --Rev. Marty Marks

#### Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible. 

# Lord's Prayer


